I am running the Bournemouth Marathon on Sunday 4th October to raise money for the Poole Hospital Children's Ward, an extremely worthy cause that is close to my heart.

When our daughter, Shaya, was five weeks old she was extremely poorly with bronchiolitis and had to be rushed into resuscitation by ambulance (during which journey she stopped breathing) at Poole Hospital and then onto the high dependency unit on the Children's Ward where she was quickly placed onto a machine that breathed for her and was looked after so expertly and with such compassion. She made a full recovery thanks to the amazing staff and her own strength! She is now a healthy (slightly cheeky) five year old and we will always be eternally grateful to the Children's Ward for all they did for Shaya and all they do for all the children they look after in the local area. I am sure that many of you have had an experience where your

child / children have been looked after by the Children's Ward at Poole Hospital which is why I felt it was important to raise awareness and funds for this deserving cause.

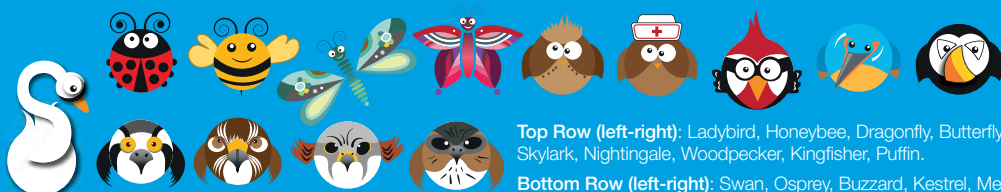
lunchtime, run by Mrs Markham. For more information about any of these activities please speak to Mrs Pratten or Mrs Markham.

Hi everyone,

Welcome to the new school year. I hope all your little ones (and the not so little ones) have settled in well. Normally our fabulous Chair of Governors, Kristine Knudsen, is the first to write in the 'Governors' section of Roundabout – but I've hijacked it as we have a very exciting new initiative for the pupils which I want to let you know about and hopefully a few of the parents can get involved with – but more about that later....

I've now been a governor for a year and it has been a really interesting time seeing what happens behind the school gates. I have learnt a lot and seen how dedicated and passionate our teachers are for their children and their success – which has also been highlighted by the recent Ofsted inspection – Well done to everyone.

This year I am continuing to be the link governor for English and have

taken on the role of Chair to the Personnel, Parents and Community Committee which I'm looking forward to. We recently met and have identified three main objectives for this year.

1. A new School website
2. Producing a parent survey for your feedback
3. How to involve parents more in the community of the school.

With the latter in mind – I'd like to introduce a new initiative (with the help of parents) in opening our very own school bank!

accounts can be opened with £1 but if your child can come in with £10 already saved at the launch, they will receive a money box to take home that day. They will also be getting 3% interest on everything they save! I greatly believe that if you can get children to enjoy saving now, they will carry it through into later life. 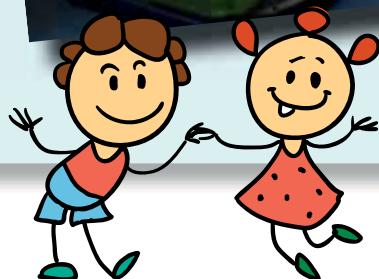
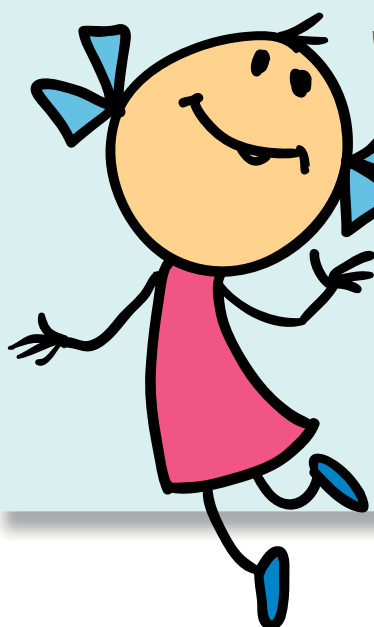

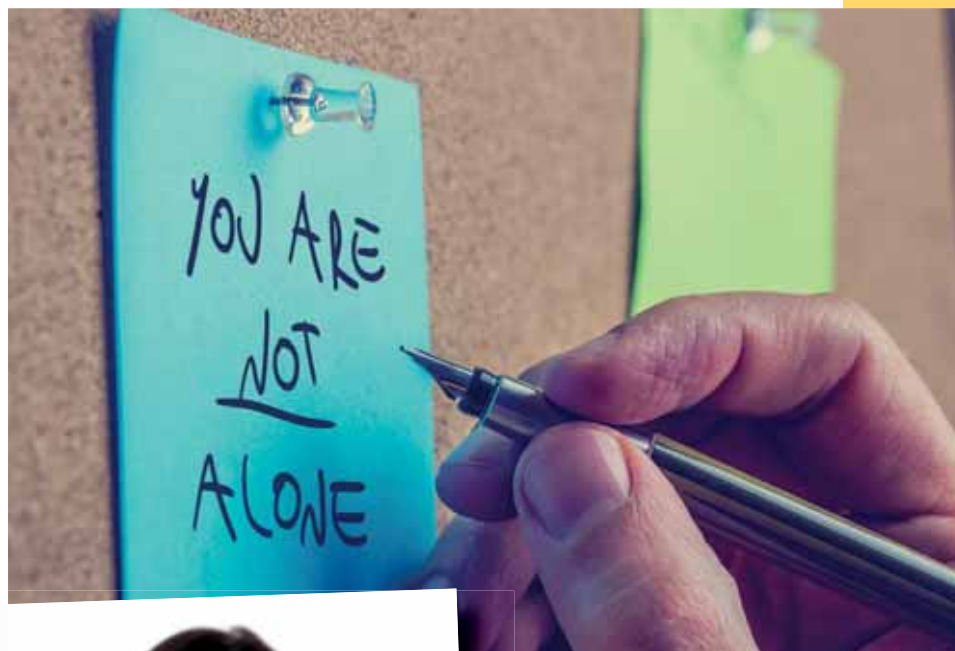
