GOVERNORS' CORNER

What exactly do our staff do on INSED days? (In-Service Training Days).

I asked some parents this exact question and the responses ranged from "being trained on the mandatory things like safeguarding" to "I've never actually thought about it but it must be important." Perhaps you too wonder what we do, so hopefully this article will be of interest to you!

As you may know, one of the positions within the Governing Body is that of Staff Governor. I have the privilege of undertaking this role whilst Mrs Foster is on maternity leave. It is very important to our Governing Body, Senior Leadership Team and Staff Members that we keep up-to-date on current pedagogy, research and resources in order to ensure we are providing our children with the highest standard of education, within an exciting and creative curriculum. We actually have in-service training every week, which takes place every Wednesday after school; and can range from Mrs Helm sharing strategies or resources to support our children with special educational needs, to Mr France updating us on the current Government agenda, outside agencies visiting us to share ideas on teaching dance (this one was great fun!) and teachers sharing their best practice.

On Tuesday 4th January, whilst the children were enjoying the last day of their Christmas holidays, we met as a Staff for our INSED day to welcome a visiting speaker called Roy Leighton. Mr France has worked with Roy in the past,

however it was the first time I had the pleasure of hearing him speak.

Roy's passion for providing happy children with a creative curriculum that challenges their thinking and encourages autonomy over their own learning, alongside awareness of their own wellbeing, was clear to see. As a school, we believe that a creative and inspiring curriculum is key to enabling every child to reach their potential. Our teachers have clearly embraced many of Roy's educational strategies and began to implement them in their classrooms the very next day! In my, perhaps biased, opinion, this is one of the truly amazing things about the staff at LMPS; they will go over and above for our children, even if it means adding to their already demanding workload.

Roy's theories are based on research, coupled with years of experience. The model he introduced to our staff is called 'The Butterfly Model' and he showed us how, through 'The Learning Line,' we can help our children to understand what the process of learning is; in other words, their learning journey. The emphasis of success is put more on the child's journey, rather than their attainment. Put simply, we all start the process of learning not really knowing what to do. We then go down into the learning pit where we experience all sorts of thoughts and feelings, such as anxiety or stress. Children need to know that it might not be easy in the learning pit and we might have to make plenty of mistakes first, but if we know ourselves as learners and try hard, without giving up, we will reach our goal and this is a fantastic feeling! Once we have

succeeded in our learning objective, we climb out of the pit! (The basic plot of any Disney film!) Only when we are happy to go through the, at times, difficult journey to achieve our goals, do we have a 'Growth Mindset'. Our job then as teachers is to provide a stimulating and safe environment, with challenges pitched at the right level for this to happen.

This is certainly not a new idea and we have always encouraged children to think about how they learn and to take independence over their own learning, but the learning line is a very effective visual reminder. The teachers and TAs have started introducing the 'Learning Line' into their classes in age-appropriate and highly creative ways. Some fantastic learning lines are appearing across all year groups with children beginning to take more responsibility for what their learning lines look like in different Year Groups.

We hope the children will soon be able to tell you more about their own learning journey as we continue to embrace and embed this further into our school. Please do speak to your child's class teacher if you would like more information on the 'Learning Line'.

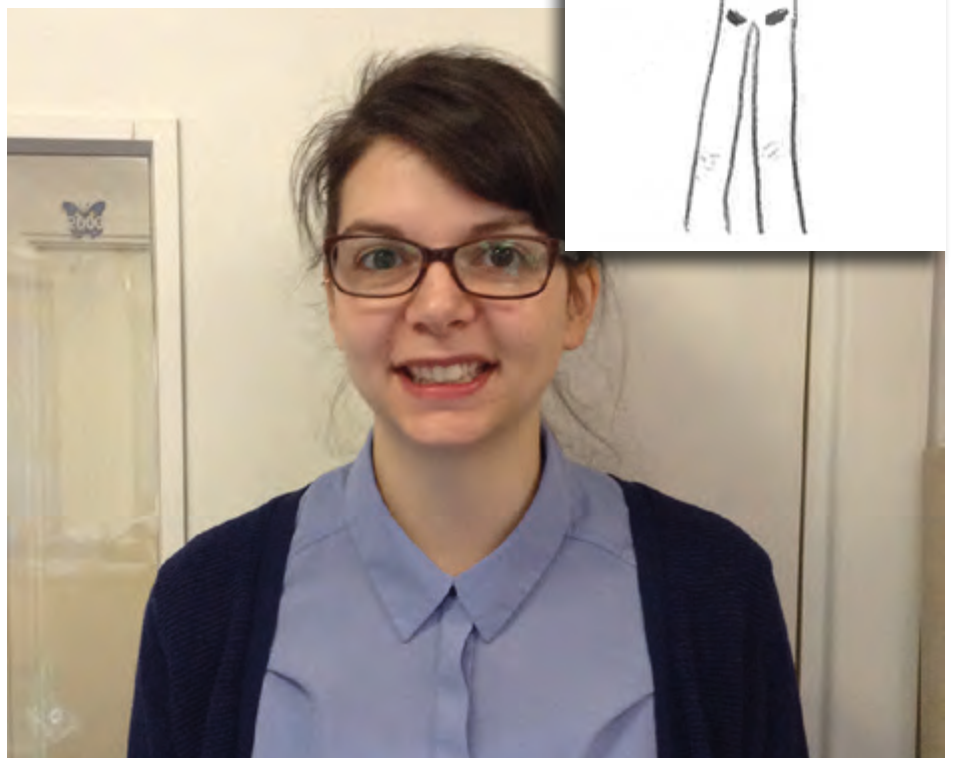

Stay Well This Winter

A message from the school nurse

Flu can be very unpleasant for children, and they can easily spread the illness to other more vulnerable family members or relatives, for whom the illness can be severe. To help protect your child and family, all children aged between two and seven are being offered the flu vaccine in the form of a quick, safe and pain-free nasal spray. If you wish for your child to have the flu vaccine, please await contact by the school nursing service, or contact your GP surgery.

Food Safety

To help your family stay happy and healthy over the winter months, some simple steps can be taken at home to help prevent illness. Washing your hands while preparing food, keeping raw and cooked food separate and checking that all food is cooked thoroughly is the easiest way to keep your family safe.

The winter vomiting bug- or norovirus- is common in school children, and can spread very easily. Infection is normally mild and lasts for about three days-

but can also be severe. If your child is suffering with vomiting and diarrhoea, they must not attend school until 48 hours after the last symptoms. Instead, they should stay at home with plenty of fluids, bland food if hungry and should be given paracetamol if they have a temperature. The GP can't prescribe anything for norovirus, but do contact NHS 111 if you are concerned about your child's condition or if symptoms persist for more than three days. Washing hands frequently will help to stop the bug from spreading,

If your child has bloody diarrhoea or is very unwell, please seek immediate advice from your GP or NHS 111.

Catch it. Bin it. Kill it.

If your child has a minor cough or cold, they should be well enough to attend school. However, if they have a raised temperature, shivers or drowsiness, they shouldn't be in school. Colds are caused by a virus, and as such, antibiotics won't help. Paracetamol is the best way to

help reduce a high temperature. If your child has more severe symptoms, you should ring NHS 111. By covering our mouths when sneezing or coughing, washing hands thoroughly and throwing away tissues, we can all help prevent the spread of coughs and colds.

Rashes

If your child has a rash, it should be considered as the first sign of an illness, and they shouldn't go to school, until the rash has been checked by your GP or practice nurse. Please ring the practice in advance and do not allow your child to sit in the waiting room with a rash,

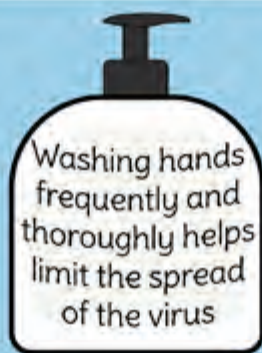

During Parent's Evening 1 on Wednesday 8th February, we are lucky enough to have the Safe Schools & Communities Team (SSCT) in Puffin Classroom, delivering an E-Safety information for our parents from 6.00 – 7.00pm.

COME ALONG/DROP IN AND FIND OUT HOW TO KEEP YOUR CHILDREN SAFE ONLINE!

Our children have access to the Internet via school, friends, and libraries and even via mobile phones and games stations, so this information is important even if you may not have Internet access in the home.

There have been incidents recently highlighted by the media that have raised enquires from parents and carers, as to **HOW** they can protect their children whilst on the Internet. In response to this, the Safe Schools & Communities Team have put together information sessions for parents and carers.

Whilst we seek to protect our children it is important to keep the risk in perspective, as there are benefits to the use of the Internet. It is really a case of taking simple, sensible steps along with parental/ carer vigilance, to minimise the risk, and equip our children with the knowledge and skills to keep them safe from harm.

The Internet is a great tool ...but it does have a 'Dark Side' and the whole concept of this session is to raise your awareness so you can identify where threats and potential dangers can lie.

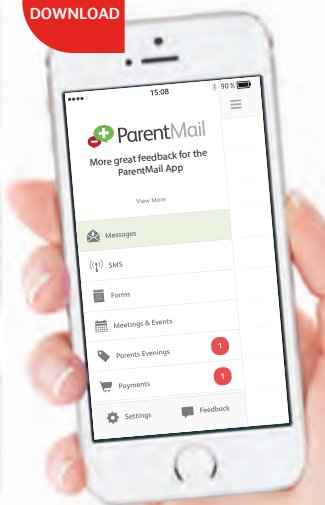
